[All coverage was within a 24 km (15 mi.) diameter circle]

Count date: Dec. 16, 2017 (8:20 to 16:55 hours)

Sky & precipitation: 90% cloud cover at start and 5% at end; no precipitation at start and none at end.

Ground & water conditions: 100% snow cover with a crust (max. depth 20 cm) with 100% ice cover on Northwest and Little Southwest

Miramichi Rivers, ponds 100% frozen, and brooks 95% frozen.

Temp.: -15° C to -6° C

Wind direction and speed: W 5 km/h at start and W 5 km/h at end

Total participants: 14 (6 field observers in 3 field parties, plus 8 persons at 6 feeders)

Total party-hours: 14.5 by car and 0.5 on foot **Total party-km:** 302 by car and 1.0 on foot

Instructions:

The mammal count can and should be done at the same time as the Xmas Bird Count in a circle 24 ms (15 mi) in diameter and should be conducted on one day between December 14^{th} and January 5^{th} .

Examples on how to fill out the sheet:

- 2, (T) 3 Snowshoe hare = this means that 2 snowshoe hares have been seen but also 3 different set of tracks during the count day.
- 4, (E) 1, (H) 1 Eastern coyote means that 4 coyotes were seen but also 1 excrement and one was heard.

Totals: 54 individuals of **4** species on count day plus 0 additional species during count period.
