Count circle: RED BANK / SUNNY CORNER (centered at intersection of Route 425 and Boom Road)

[All coverage was within a 24 km (15 mi.) diameter circle]

Count date: Dec. 19, 2020 (7:46 to 16:45 hours)

Sky & precipitation: 100% cloud cover at start and 90% at end; no precipitation all day.

Ground & water conditions: 100% snow cover (max. depth 10 cm) with 100% ice cover on Northwest Miramichi River, but with a few open

places on Little Southwest Miramichi River, ponds 100% frozen, and brooks 75% frozen.

Temp.: -6° C to $+3^{\circ}$ C

Wind direction and speed: W <5 km/h at start and negligible at end.

Total participants Count Day: 18 (8 field observers in 4 field parties, plus 10 persons at 8 feeders)

Total party-hours: 17.75 by car and 6.75 on foot Total party-km: 472.9 by car and 18.2 on foot

Examples on how to fill out the sheet:

- 2, (T) 3 Snowshoe hare = this means that 2 snowshoe hares have been seen but also 3 different set of tracks during the count day.
- 4, (E) 1, (H) 1 Eastern coyote means that 4 coyotes were seen but also 1 excrement and one was heard.

Totals: 59 individuals of 4 species, 4 tracks of 3 species, and 1 dead seen on count day.
